Dear Administrator Brooks-LaSure,

As strong proponents of the Medicaid program, we wish to reaffirm our deep commitment to ensuring that all Medicaid patients have access to their choice of provider for sexual and reproductive health care services. We are deeply concerned that several states already have excluded qualified sexual and reproductive health care providers from their respective Medicaid programs in violation of federal Medicaid law. We request that the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) fulfill its duty to ensure health care access for people with low incomes and enforce Medicaid's free choice of provider requirement immediately.

The "free choice of provider" guarantee of the federal Medicaid Act is a longstanding and fundamental protection that has afforded beneficiaries timely access to necessary health care services.¹ Despite this guarantee, Arkansas, Mississippi, Missouri, and Texas have terminated Planned Parenthood as a provider.²³⁴ In some states, patients have been blocked from accessing Planned Parenthood health centers for more than a year. In Missouri, Planned Parenthood providers are absorbing all costs of care, which will become more and more financially burdensome as time goes on. Missouri and Mississippi have terminated other specialized reproductive health providers from their state programs. In addition, similar providers in Louisiana and South Carolina are only able to participate in the program because of the courts stepping in and blocking similar state efforts.

These state actions have no basis other than an animus towards reproductive health providers and the patients with low incomes they serve. They represent a collective attack on the integrity of the Medicaid program and the people it serves. And since these providers have an outsized role in serving patients with low incomes, Medicaid patients and their families are the ones who are harmed as a result. For many patients of reproductive age in these and other states, Planned Parenthood providers are their only source of health care. These state actions delay and impede timely access to critical health services.

We urge CMS to take action to protect the Medicaid program and expand access to sexual and reproductive health care services. What has happened in Arkansas, Texas, Mississippi, and Missouri will not end in these states. Without enforcement, even more states might see their reproductive health care severely restricted and pushed out of reach for communities most in need of the vital services provided by Planned Parenthood. The agency, under the Obama administration, has already warned that states cannot withhold Medicaid funding from Planned Parenthood and block people with Medicaid from accessing care at Planned Parenthood health centers. But more can and should be done to enforce the free choice of provider requirement.

We request that CMS ensure health care access for people with Medicaid—who are disproportionately people of color, LGBTQ+ people, women, and other marginalized groups who face systemic barriers to economic advancement— and enforce Medicaid's free choice of provider requirement immediately.

We look forward to the opportunity to assist you in this effort and appreciate your attention to this matter.
