Dear Chair Khan:

Thank you for your work to protect consumers from deceptive and unfair practices, particularly when it comes to safeguarding consumers' privacy. We write to you today to urge you to immediately use the full power of your office to protect those seeking abortion from predatory companies. We are extremely disturbed by evidence that data brokers have collected and sold location data that allows unscrupulous actors to target those seeking reproductive health care, including abortion care. The Supreme Court's recent ruling in *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization*, which overturned a half century of legal precedent protecting the federal right to seek an abortion, makes this matter all the more urgent.

At the local, state, and federal level, efforts to stop women from making their own decisions about abortion care are increasing. These efforts have increased even though there is substantial evidence that being denied access to abortion has devastating and long-term effects on women's physical and mental health as well as economic security and stability. Recent legislation, including Texas's Senate Bill 8, rewards vigilantes who track down women seeking abortions and those who assist them. Unsurprisingly, these laws pitting Americans against each other have led to predatory practices by individuals seeking to profit from persecuting women making personal and private health decisions.

Recently, reports in multiple news sources have detailed how people's digital data can be used to reveal whether they have searched for or visited an abortion clinic, sought mifepristone and misoprostol for medication abortions, or when their periods, ovulation, and pregnancy started and stopped. For example, in May 2022, SafeGraph, a location data firm, sold a week's worth of private location information of people visiting abortion clinics for only \$160.² This information includes where people visiting the clinics came from, the duration of time spent there, and where they went after leaving. SafeGraph has publicly stated it has voluntarily stopped selling this information. Yet stronger safeguards must be put in place to prevent abusive data practices that can lead to the investigation or prosecution of those seeking medical services, including abortions. The need for vigilant enforcement of established privacy standards is clear.

Consistent with current law, we are convinced these acts are unfair practices that "cause or are likely to cause substantial injury to consumers which is not reasonably avoidable by consumers

themselves and not outweighed by countervailing benefits to consumers or to competition" (15 U.S.C. § 45). The collection and sale of this information creates a significant danger of substantial harm to the privacy rights of consumers, including safety and health injuries.

Specifically, we request that you immediately act within your authority to investigate these practices, issue warning letters to predatory actors as needed, and pursue robust enforcement against illegal acts.

We also encourage you to review all practices that rely on technology to conduct vigilante surveillance of people seeking health care. Anti-abortion extremists are increasingly turning to technology to increase surveillance of women, in support of their efforts to deny people the right to make their own decisions about their bodies, health, and lives. Already, Texas Right to Life has launched a hotline encouraging citizens to submit tips about who is seeking abortions. In addition, anti-abortion groups have been using geo-fencing technology in fertility apps to target women who visit health clinics with anti-abortion propaganda. Sadly, this breach of privacy and harassment may increase in light of the opinion in *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization*.

Thank you for your unwavering commitment to protect Americans from harmful business practices. No one should be hunted down and persecuted for seeking reproductive health care. We appreciate your assistance in this matter and look forward to your response.
