- As individuals begin to assess damage and make repairs to area homes and businesses, contact 8-1-1 to have utility lines marked before you dig to keep everyone safe.
 - Keep any receipts for damages and take lots of pictures before repairs!
 - It is illegal for a company to sell fuel, food, medicine, lodging, building materials, construction tools, or other necessities at an excessive price during a state of emergency. Report price gouging here: harriscountycao.org/pricegouging

Helpful Tips

- Unplug any non-essential electronics and turn your thermostat down to 68 to help the grid and conserve energy.
- Wear layers, especially hats and socks, to keep warm.
- Stay inside and limit opening doors.
- Do NOT bring in any heating equipment meant for the outdoors like grills, heaters, or cars, as this can lead to carbon monoxide poisoning.
- Stay off the roads, and if you must drive, do so slowly and be cautious of icy roads.
- · Limit water use as much as possible and fill bathtubs/buckets to use to prepare for possible water loss.
- Locate the water turn off in your home and turn off if you do not have water to prevent pipes bursting once the weather warms up. If you need assistance turning off your water, please call 3-1-1 and Houston Water will walk you through the steps.
 - If you are aware of a broken pipe or water main in your neighborhood, please call 3-1-1 so Houston Public Works can isolate the leak.

Health Care

• Teladoc Health, Inc. is providing free, 24/7 general medical telehealth visits to Oklahoma and Texas residents, first responders and others directly impacted by winter storms. Individuals who have been displaced or cannot access medical care as a result of the winter weather can seek treatment from a board-certified, state licensed physician for any non-emergency illness by calling Teladoc directly at 855-225-5032.

Vulnerable Populations

- Mayor Sylvester Turner, together with the Houston Public Works and the Houston Parks and Recreation Department, will begin the delivery of water to Senior Citizen Facilities, beginning at 12:00 on February 18.

Boil water notice tips

- Only use bottled water or water that has been boiled for 1–2 minutes (after reaching a rolling boil). Individuals without power to boil water are advised to use bottled water.
- Do not use water from any appliance, such as ice and water from a refrigerator.
- Brush teeth with boiled or bottled water, do not use untreated tap water.
- See if this affects your address here.
- The City expects to have stabilized pressures back into the operational range before the end of the day on Thursday, February 18. It could take another 24-48 hours past that point to receive the all-clear from the State of Texas and lift the Boil Water Notice.
